- **In the communities there is a shortage of items** like sugar, salt, cooking oil, porridge, diapers and milk. There aren't any shops. The government is sending food packages. We complete these where necessary and possible.

- **the extra income** from Inca Trail tourism for the villagers has vanished and the sales of wool and potatoes are on hold.
